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Minutes

CDN General Assembly 2022 (March 12-13)

Due to the ongoing war in Ukraine and consequently instability in the Region the General Assembly (GA) of CDN originally planned in Tbilisi, Georgia is taking place online on the Zoom platform on the 12th and 13th of March 2022. All the information on joining the call and technicalities around using the platform are timely communicated to the registered attendees (MO and PO delegates, candidates, WG representatives, guests).

Day 1 – 12th of March 2022

10:00–10:15 CET

- **Opening of the GA - Welcome speech by Executive Committee**

Selma, CDN Executive Committee member welcomes attendees to the GA, explains moving the GA 2022 Online due to the ongoing war in Ukraine and shares full support and solidarity with the people in Ukraine.

10:00–10:55 CET

- **Announcement of dissolution of Bulgarian Young Greens**

Giorgi, CDN Network Coordinator announces to the GA the decision on the dissolution of Bulgarian Young Greens. They have been members of CDN for quite some time, however, recently, they were not active and have emailed CDN explaining that they do not exist any more.

- **Verification of the presence of the delegates from Member and Partner Organisations, distribution of votes, quorum check and validation of General Assembly**

Giorgi, CDN Network Coordinator explains the process of quorum check and validation of GA.

Present Organisations: Green Window, Belarus Young Greens, Gutta Club, Revolt, Albanian Young Greens, Frontline Youth Network, Protests, German Young Greens, Young Greens of Georgia, and Green Youth of Serbia.

More than half of the organisations (with Bulgarian Young Greens dissolution) - 10 (Member and Partner Organisations) are present. GA is validated.

As already presented in the GTKEO session on the previous day, Giorgi, CDN Network Coordinator explains the platform (*cdn.discuss.green*) that will be used for voting and attendees go through test voting once again (the first test was performed on the GTKEO session).

One organisation was missing from test voting so the test was repeated again. We have 16 voting rights.

- **Adoption of Presidency and Electoral Committee**

Giorgi, CDN Network Coordinator proposes Presidency to the GA: Maja Klimentic, former EC member of CDN and Justine Pantalejeva, member of CDN PO Protest and member of CDN Alternative Urbanisation WG.

We have 16 voting rights and for the presidency to be approved we need a 2/3 (11) majority.

Results - 12/0/0.

Presidency takes over.

- **Presentation of IRPs GA chapter**

Maja from Presidency presents IRPs GA chapter. All deadlines were respected. The deadline for applying for new Executive Committee members was prolonged due to the minimum criteria was not being met. We also have a new Executive Committee application (Paula "Pablo" Luīze Pastore) due to an extension.

GA unanimously approves that all procedures have been respected and that GA can take place.

- **Presentation of the GA rules, (voting, majorities);**

Maja from Presidency explains GA rules, voting and election procedures and majorities. Each MOs had 2 votes and one of them can be cast to the 1st delegate – as the voting is taking place on the CDN GA website (*cdn.discuss.green*) 1st delegate would need to have 2 votes.

There are 16 present votes on the GA, meaning that absolute majority is 9 votes and 2/3 majority is 11 votes. Abstentions count as 'no'.

Maja opened the floor to questions. No questions.

- **Voting on the minutes from the last GA**

Maja from Presidency presents minutes from the last GA to be validated. This year we also have minutes taker and the minutes will be presented after the GA.

In order to adopt the minutes from the last GA, we would need a 2/3 majority (11 votes).

11 votes for yes on the platform and Milica (delegate from Green Youth of Serbia) has 2nd voting right and is counting as 2 votes in chat. In total, we have 16 votes.

Network Coordinator comments on the presentation and opens the floor to questions.

Question from Network Coordinator on best ways to pressure our governments.

Questions from Palina (delegate from Belarus Young Greens) on private matters and what would be the best support from Belarus.

Alma (guest from Swedish Young Greens) shares a message of support and asks for technical information regarding the presentation being available.

Network Coordinator replies that we will make sure to distribute the presentation among attendees.

Question from Vahid (guest from MIL Network) on why is the global south not joining against Russia.

The GA is reassembled.

Maja from Presidency thanks everyone for the previous and opens the 2nd day of the GA.

Justine from Presidency opens up the floor for Vahid's (guest from MIL Network) request on raising up the safe space violation that had happened yesterday.

Vahid elaborates on the issue.

Justine from Presidency announces that we will start with a quorum check.

Maja from Presidency announces and emphasizes the importance of voting today and checks if everyone has access to the platform through email.

Maja from Presidency explains how the questions to Executive Committee will take place - using the randomiser platform again for choosing the order of EC Candidates each round while answering questions for all EC Candidates.

Justine from Presidency elaborates again on how are questions taking place.

- You get a surprise donation of extra 10 000 euros for CDN, what do you do?
- Do you think you are a responsible person? prove it in your speech
- How would you change the internal organization of CDN and, especially, the office?

- How do you plan to use the knowledge gained in your home organisation?
- How can we as a green movement be hopeful in 2020s?
